EdFEST 2025 Recap



EdFEST 2025 Overview

Despite a 10-day delay in launching EdFEST registration, we exceeded last year's attendance numbers at both events.

- **5,509** total attendees
- **NEW** venue for EdFEST (PK3 – Grade 8) for the first time in 10+ years





SY26-27 Application Trends

How many Applicants Enter the Lottery Each Year?


Over 22,000 applicants have entered the lottery each year since 2022 and a similar number is anticipated this year based on current application trends.



In 2025, the number of unique applicants decreased from the prior two years.

Total Submitted Unique Applicants


Overall submitted applicants are comparable to the same period last year (-172, -2%), and significantly behind SY24-25 (-1,131, -12%).

Total Submitted Unique Applicants by Grade Band


High School applications are slightly ahead, while Early Childhood and Elementary grades lag behind previous years.



Data compares 1/19/2024 vs. 1/20/2025 vs 1/20/2026.


Total Submitted Unique Applicants by Entry Grade



LEA Update & Policy Review/Discussion

Capital Village PCS - School Closure

Background

- ❖ On 3/8/23, PCSB placed Capital Village PCS on its Financial Monitoring List due to its declining enrollment and below-target actual and budgeted financial indicators.
- ❖ To address increasing concerns, PCSB placed Capital Village on a **Financial Corrective Action Plan (FCAP)** on 10/28/24. It was amended on 6/3/25 to address a missed FCAP target.
- ❖ On 4/7/25, PCSB issued its 5-Year Charter Review Report, recommending to conditionally continue Capital Village's charter.
- ❖ On 11/17/25, PCSB informed MSDC that the school missed FCAP targets and was considering a recommendation for revocation.
- ❖ On 12/4/25, the Capital Village PCS Board voted to relinquish its charter and cease operations at the end of SY25-26.

My School DC Response/Actions

- ❖ MSDC removed Capital Village from its SY26-27 lottery application before the application was launched
- ❖ MSDC also removed the LEA from our online resources.
- ❖ Capital Village PCS representatives attended the PK3 – Grade 8 EdFEST event to inform current families that they need to apply to a new school for SY26-27.

MSDC Current Policy: LEAs with Uncertain Operating Status

Current Policy Language

If the operating status of a campus or LEA is uncertain, MSDC should recommend that the LEA make zero seats available in the lottery. This will prevent students from being matched with the school while allowing the school to generate waitlists, which can be utilized if the school remains open. Making zero seats available minimizes the negative impact of any closure, consolidation, or acquisition on new students.

Challenges

- 1) Does not define what makes a campus or LEA's operating status uncertain using available metrics
- 2) Relies on the LEA telling us if their status is uncertain or MSDC investing valuable time and energy to chase down that information since it is rarely publicly posted
- 3) Only recommends action, rather than mandating action to protect students.

Current Policy Goal & Objectives

GOAL = To safeguard the lottery's smooth operations and stability by ensuring MSDC is informed about schools with uncertain operating status in time to take corrective action to protect families' interests.

Objectives	Metrics or Method of Implementation
Define what threshold (or available metrics) make a school's operating status "uncertain" enough to warrant lottery action.	Failure to meet conditions for charter continuance (per charter review process) *
Ensure MSDC is informed about schools with uncertain operating status in time to take corrective action BEFORE the lottery application is released (optimally) or the lottery runs.	Consultation with PCSB staff*
Protect families from applying and being matched to schools that may close.	Remove seats from lottery
Protect LEAs so they have new students to enroll if they remain open.	Still allow families to apply to the LEA and add all applicants to their waitlist. If the LEA stays open, they can extend enrollment offers from their waitlist.
Make sure the policy is cross-sector in its focus.	None yet identified.


Questions for Board consideration:


